Expectations

Grades

Grades will be based on class work, homework, projects, quizzes, tests, and a final project in accordance with the Unity Center for Urban Technology's official grading policy. Because this is a project-centered course is vital that each student give his/her best effort to respect deadlines and keep up with steps in the assigned projects. For each marking period, students will receive a grade, and the final grade will be a cumulative (semester long) grade that will appear on the official transcript. Cutting Class and Absences

Any unexcused absences will result in a grade of "zero" for any work missed that day, including class work, quizzes, tests, homework, or projects. An absence will be excused if the student provides a note from a doctor or a parent, however the quizzes, tests, homework or projects must be made up.
